Treadwell

3 ...Chef Stephen Treadwell took a gamble in forsaking security of the big hotels for a waterside place of his own in Port Dalhousie. With hard work and integrity, he and his sommelier son, James, have earned their fair share of the pot. The restaurant's farm-to-table theme means plates are garnished with superb leaves and vegetables from, say, Wyndym Farm (including the most piquant rocket I've ever tasted), not to mention Niagara vinegars, cheeses and cold pressed canola oil, Lake Erie perch and locally raised meats are just as carefully sourced. Though he keeps his plates simple, Treadwell knows how to bring out the best in such ingredients, poaching Cumbrae's pork belly in 7Up until it almost melts, enhancing the earthly sweetness of golden beets with saffron and smoked ricotta. Slow foodies can admire the righteousness of it all, but the dining room is too comfortable to be a pulpit, with a mesmerizing view of turbulent water and a reasonable priced wine list bejewelled with old and rare Niagara Vintages. This is the next important step in the evolution of Niagara wine country cuisine
